
Now is an exciting time to be part of Newham College London. In November 2024 we united with NewVIc.

BONNY DOWNS COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION

A community-led charity serving Newham since 1998; tackling the causes of poverty, isolation, promoting community cohesion and redeveloping disused spaces into community places. Jamie Purser and his team proudly presented two large boxes of school clothing, generously provided by our partners John Lewis, with the boxes artistically designed and presented by our supported learning students.



STEEL WARRIORS: TURNING WEAPONS INTO WORKOUTS

A unique sport-for-good charity, Steel Warriors, believes that how knife crime should be tackled needs a rethink. It's the only charity in the UK that melts down seized knives and transforms the steel into outdoor gyms - turning a symbol of violence into one of strength. In November 2024 it launched a new Gym on the Carpenters Estate in Newham, part of the aim to empower young people with the confidence to walk the street unarmed and promote physical and mental wellbeing through accessible fitness.

In March, we welcomed Steel Warriors to Newham College Stratford Campus to run four challenging lunchtime callisthenics sessions for our students with fantastic levels of engagement.

Lyndsey Phillips, Head of Youth Prevention said, "Our vision is to create a UK-wide network of gyms that empower young people to pursue their passions and achieve their goals, while building stronger, connected, and compassionate communities.

Through the growing sport of calisthenics, we support young people affected by crime, violence, and social exclusion; to develop the skills and confidence they need to build positive futures."

RENEWAL PROGRAMME, NEWHAM

For over 50 years, the Renewable Programme has supported those in Newham who face a range of challenges by providing a Food Bank, warm meals, Community Hub, ESOL & Digital Skills classes and more. Despite hot conditions on Sunday 27 April, the 2025 London Marathon set a new world record. We're delighted that Saminah, a biology teacher at NewVIc Sixth Form Centre, who was selected from 850, 000 applicants, ran an impressive time of 6 hours and 45 minutes. Saminah raised over £3,500 for Ataxia UK, a charity close to her heart. Ataxia is a neurological condition that can affect walking and balance, hand coordination, speech and swallowing, and eye movements.

Proudly wearing her medal of participation she said, "Crossing the finish line was an amazing experience! I completed 16 weeks of intensive training - at one point I suffered from a soft tissue condition. My doctor asked me to stop training so I could recover, but I ignored their advice! Having come this far I was determined to complete my training plan and take part in the race.









In 2026, the historic Canning Town Old Library will reopen as Newham's new Heritage Centre; a welcoming community space dedicated to exploring the borough's extraordinary history. It will include an exhibition space, a reading room, archive storage and a dedicated learning area — breathing new life into a much-loved Victorian building.

This renovation project acted as springboard for a unique ten-week creative programme for 12 lucky graphic design students from NewVlc Sixth Form. Neilcott Construction guided them through the building's history - then they worked alongside Newham Council, creative facilitators, their tutors, and project architects Haworth Tompkins to develop fresh brand ideas. Inspired by the library's Victorian architecture, the students produced bold, thoughtful logo design concepts.

The project culminated in a celebration event where the Mayor of Newham officially unveiled the winning logo, designed by Graphic Design student Marius. His striking design echoed the distinctive architectural shapes found in archive spaces, prominently featuring the letter 'H' to symbolise history and heritage.

Mayor Rokhsana Fiaz OBE said; "This project is a powerful example of how young people can actively shape the cultural identity of their community. The new logo not only captures the vibrant spirit of Newham but also reflects the diverse stories we seek to preserve and celebrate."

Marius's winning logo will appear in campaigns and branding when the Newham Heritage Centre opens its doors in 2026.




"I'm originally from Uganda and I was new to the country. I chose the college which responded to me the quickest – and I do not regret my decision!"

I've been teaching since 2013 and been a lecturer at Newham College London since 2017. My specialism is Electrical and Mechanical Engineering.

I love innovating, preparing my learners to learn engineering skills and work in industry as an engineer. There are lots of routes you can take into engineering either as an apprenticeship or a degree via university. To succeed on the course, students need advanced mathematical skills, technical skills. At the IoT, students have access to cutting edge electrical and mechanical equipment. They are also given challenging projects to work on, for example this year students develop a new style of windmill and solar panels - traditional ones have limited capabilities to produce more energy and power.

I completed a BEng Mechanical Engineering at Kingston University and hold a Master's in aerospace engineering. Growing up I really enjoyed problem solving, taking things apart and fixing things.

Why did you become a teacher?

Level 2 Hairdressing – Intensive course

Hairdressing is my passion. I chose to study at East Ham campus because it is local to me. I've been waiting 20 years to do this course! I have dreamed about becoming a hairdresser ever since I was a child. Now my children are older, I finally have time to follow my dreams!

"I like this course because it is a fast-track one-year course which has been packed into 6 months. I've learnt skills such as shampooing, styling, colour theory and cutting men and women's hair. I also build my experience working on client's hair in The Cut, a real live working hair salon at East Ham campus. Currently, I'm learning how to test the elasticity and porosity of hair. I want to understand hair loss and the range of treatments to help clients who suffer from this condition.

The teachers are great at explaining things and go the extra mile to help you - for example, if I forget to bring in some kit, my teacher is happy to loan out equipment.

The facilities are great and it's a very mixed class. I love the fact that we all get on so well and encourage each other.

Once I've completed the course, I will be able to earn more money!"





NADINE TAILORS A NEW CAREER

Back in 2017 Nadine started up her own fashion business, but I had to put her plans on hold when Covid hit. She's now re-starting her business which will focus on bespoke, made to measure items.

"Originally, I had planned to go to university to study fashion design. I had no idea what fashion tailoring was until I came across this course."

"The teaching is solid, and the support provided is amazing. You cover the basics and build your skills. I also love the fact that the course is part time, two days a week, which means I can fit my other commitments. Once I've completed this course I want to progress onto the London College of Fashion."

"There aren't many black women in tailoring; I want to be amongst the first!"

HOW A SUPPORTED INTERNSHIP WORKS

- A 10-month programme running from September to June
- Participants complete 3 unpaid work experiences in a work setting. Each placement lasts 10 - 11 weeks
- Learners complete tutorials covering English, maths, employability skills as well as job specific skills such as work behaviour, teamwork, communication, problem solving, budgeting and IT

Advanced Learner Loans are designed to make studying as an adult more accessible and can be used to help you with the cost of your course fees.


5 KEY FACTS ABOUT THE LOAN

- Repayments are linked to what you earn and not how much you borrowed.
- You only have to start making repayments when you've finished your course and you're earning over £25,725 a year (which is £535 a week or £2,143 a month). Until then you don't need to pay back anything.
- If your income drops below these thresholds, repayments pause and resume when your earnings rise.
- Repayment begins in April after completing or leaving your course.
- Flexibility to make voluntary payments anytime to speed up loan clearance.



Note: If you're studying an Access to HE course and then go on to complete an eligible HE qualification Student Finance England will write off your 19+ Advanced Learner Loan so you will not have to repay it at all.


CORINA'S PROVING WHAT'S POSSIBLE
